NORTHWESTERN PENINSULAR **AESCUSA**

The Villaescusa Nature Trail starts at the Cabárceno Nature Park, runs through the town of Obregón and goes on along a paved road, surrounded by green mea dows, up to an intersection. At this point, the route turns right and runs along an uphill path that flattens


The long-standing mining tradition in this area has brought about a spectacular landscape of reddish calcareous pinna-

This nature trail is located to the North-East of Cantabria, in the vicinity of the Bay of Santander. It is 7.5 km in length and follows the old railway track between Astillero and


