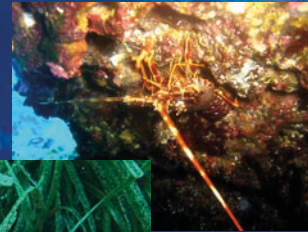


MARINE RESERVES OF SPAIN

General Secretary for Fisheries

A marine reserve is a fisheries protection zone managed for the regeneration of fishery resources, where professional fisheries with traditional gear remains, while protecting habitats and marine communities.



TOOLS

- Zoning. No activity is allowed in the no-take zone, unless for scientific purposes
- Professional Fishing Census subject to quotas
- Scuba Diving Quotes

- Interadministrative collaboration, with scientific, educational institutions and civil society



MEANS

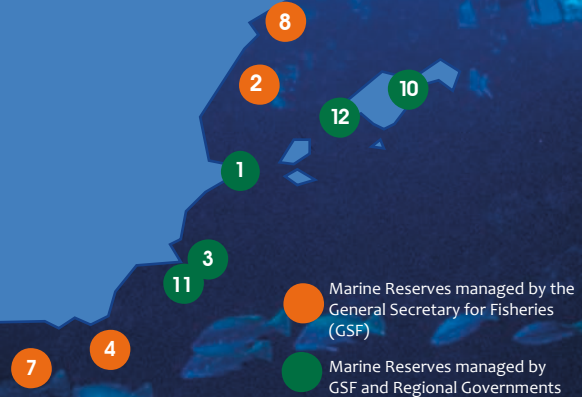
- Surveillance (Monitoring Team)

NETWORK OF SPANISH MARINE RESERVES

The General Secretary for Fisheries (GSF) manages a network of Marine Reserves of Fishing Interest in the Mediterranean and Canary coasts: some exclusively managed by the GSF and others jointly managed by the Autonomous Government and the General Secretary for Fisheries.
